## **Islamic College of Brisbane Annual Report 2024 *(Based on 2023 data)***

The Islamic College of Brisbane is an independent co-educational school offering education from Prep to Year 12. Our students come from a diverse range of cultural backgrounds with many coming from non-English speaking backgrounds, most were born in Australia. The college has 819 female students and 776 male students, with the total student population reaching 1595 in 2023, marking an increase of 103 students.

The college is dedicated to its charitable mission of advancing education through the holistic development of students. This is achieved by establishing and operating schools that provide a balanced general education grounded in Islamic faith and values. The schools aim to produce good citizens imbued with Islamic Spiritual principles by creating an educational environment that fosters an understanding of the Quran, Hadith, and one's relation to God and others. In addition to religious education, the schools offer a comprehensive curriculum spanning liberal arts, sciences, culture, vocational training, and social responsibility to prepare students for effective participation on the community.

The college strives to nurture a harmonious atmosphere that supports mutual growth, self-worth, integrity, respect, and mature judgement among staff and students. Our commitment to physical fitness is reflected in our health education programs and the involvement of students in sports and recreational activities.
